Re: Use of WhatsApp by Children under the Age of 16

I hope that you are keeping safe and well. As the Headteacher of West Moors Middle School, I am writing to you today to address an important matter regarding the use of WhatsApp by children under the age of 16. On the 26th February 2024, I sent you a letter to ensure online safety for our children. In this letter, I shared the age restrictions set by app developers for mobile phones seeking your support to enforce these as an important measure to protect our children from potential risks associated with inappropriate content, interactions and privacy concerns.

In recent times, WhatsApp has become an increasingly popular messaging application among individuals of all ages, including children. However, it is essential for us as responsible educators and parents/ carers to acknowledge the potential risks associated with its usage, particularly for our younger children.

As you may be aware, WhatsApp's terms of service state that users must be at least 16 years of age to create an account. This age restriction is in place to safeguard the well-being and privacy of young individuals. We kindly request that you support your child in ensuring that he/ she abides by this policy and refrains from using WhatsApp until they reach the appropriate age. While WhatsApp offers various features that can facilitate communication, we believe it is crucial for children to understand the importance of responsible digital citizenship. As educators, our role extends beyond the classroom, and we strive to equip our children with the necessary knowledge and skills to navigate the digital world safely.

There are alternative platforms that are more suitable for children under 16, such as Kinzoo or Messenger Kids. These platforms provide age-appropriate content and enhanced safety measures, ensuring a secure environment for our young learners to communicate and socialise.

We encourage you to engage in open conversations with your child about the responsible use of technology and the potential risks associated with inappropriate online behaviour. By instilling these values at home, we can collectively create a safer digital environment for our children.

Please can you review the apps your child currently has on his/ her phone and ensure that these are age appropriate according to set guidelines.
