Safer Internet Day, a global campaign, promotes the safe and responsible use of technology, which calls on young people, parents, careers, teachers, social workers, law enforcement, companies, policymakers and more, to join together in helping to create a better internet.

Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote here in West Moors Middle School, and celebrating Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity for us to re-emphasize the online safety messages we deliver throughout the year. Some of the activities we'll be participating in the afternoon include:

–Our plans for Safer Internet Day 2022–

Your children will be able to experience our activities for a whole afternoon on Tuesday 8th February, below are some of the activities that they will be able to complete to teach them about staying safe online. For the whole afternoon, the children will be able to learn about how the day is going to work and just more of a general idea of why it is so important we stay safe online, as the Year 8 students will be presenting a PowerPoint to the whole school.

KS2: In KS2, it is so important that we inform the students in years 5 and 6 how to stay safe online for when they are older, so they have the knowledge they will need to stay safe and out of trouble.

Year 5 and 6 will have a variety of fun quizzes, learning about the history behind computers and where they came from. They will also be able to understand the reasoning behind age ratings and why they are put in place, also they will have a chance to talk as a class about online safety, and the real reason they are there.

KS3: Here in KS3, we know how important it is that they stay online, especially at their age, activities that will be given and taught to the students in ks3 are listed below:

In years 7 and 8 they will be able to learn about the recommended age for games and social media that they may have access to when at home. They will be able to have a class discussion about the following phrase 'online gaming – is it all fun and games?'. Many of the KS3 students will play games that would be far over their age limit, and we
