Dear Parents and Carers,

Earlier this week, we had our two day Ofsted inspection, 1st February 2022-2nd February 2022. Until the final report is shared, schools are not permitted to disseminate any information however as soon as this key document is published, please be assured that I will send out a copy to everyone in our school community.

I am happy to share that our attendance is now above the national average for secondary schools which has been a great improvement following the disruption caused by a spike in the number of Covid-19 cases at the start of the year. It is so important for our children to be in school learning that every minute of learning time is precious. We would therefore value your continued support to ensure that your child arrives at school promptly for registration every day.

This week I have met with prefects in year 8, Sarah, Amy and Maddie, who would like to fundraise to buy new books for our school library. They are planning a 'Book Bash' event, launching a competition for tutor groups with more details to follow! They are also designing a Book Request poster for each tutor group so we can order books from authors that our children want to read. In addition, our Digital Leaders have been planning an assembly for Internet Safety Day next week, on the 8th February 2022, along with tutor group activities. I can honestly say that I could not be any prouder of all of these students and our prefects- they are an absolute credit to our school.

Our children's brightly-coloured, hand painted stones have been laid near the Petwyn as a tribute to the Queen's 70th Jubilee Anniversary. The patterns on these stones have been designed by children from all three schools in West Moors, celebrating this momentous occasion within our local community. Rights Respecting News

Article of the Week

Article 2: (non-discrimination): The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.

Article 13: (freedom of expression): Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information as long as it is within the law.

Article 17: (access to reliable information): Every child has the right to reliable information from a variety of sources, and governments should encourage the media to provide information that children can understand. Governments must help protect children from materials that could harm them.

During our weekly assembly we asked the children 'Why is it important to listen to, learn from and celebrate people's differences in school and in our community?'

The children came up with a range of excellent responses:

- It helps to remind us we are all unique
 - It reminds us we all have different experiences and everyone has the right to be listened to and express their opinions
 - Helps everyone feel welcome and valued in our school
- By listening to others we can continue to learn and grow as individuals

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INTERNET SAFETY MESSAGE

Today, we have been made aware of some concerning chat and sexually explicit images that have been shared through a WhatsApp group called 'Weirdo'. This is a very large group of over 100 members and includes pupils from different schools across Dorset. We strongly advise that parents check their child's phone tonight, remove them from this group immediately (and preferably from WhatsApp in general) and step up the monitoring of what their child is doing online. We are finding that issues relating to the unmonitored use of WhatsApp on pupils' phones is becoming a significant safeguarding issue and that pupils are not applying the repeated messages they are given in ICT and PSHCE in the way that they are acting online. The potential for adults to be part of this group and the dangers this could pose for your child should not be underestimated. This activity is all happening in time outside of school hours, especially over the weekend. It is a parents responsibility to monitor the use of phones but I fully understand that this is not easy to do. However, we would give all parents the following advice:

- Ensure that you have all the passwords to your child's phone and that you check through their phones regularly.
- • Change the time you look at their phone so that they do not have any opportunity to remove content as they know it will be inspected.
- Do not allow phones in the bedroom whilst they sleep (regardless of what they tell you, this is quite reasonable and what happens to most of their friends)

- Talk to your child regularly about the dangers of social media and how important it is that they only ever are in groups where they know everyone involved
 - Encourage them to tell you when they see things that they should not see, even if it means a friend or classmate getting into trouble with their parents
 - Whilst children have a right to privacy, you have the ultimate responsibility to safeguard your child from harm. If your child will not hand over their phone, ask yourself why
