## **Rights Respecting News**

Article of the Week

In this week's article of the week assembly, we explored article 42, which is, 'Knowledge of rights'. It is imperative that Governments actively work to make sure children and adults know about the Convention. As a Silver Rights Respecting school, we implement these rights in to the ethos of our school each and every day.

During the assembly we discussed all of the ways that we celebrate rights as a school and what is needed for every adult and child to know about children's rights. These include, for example:

- The Government and politicians should talk about rights and help people to understand them.
- It should feel 'normal' for people to know that children have rights.
- All schools should teach about rights.
- People who work with children such as teachers, youth workers, police and social workers should be trained about children's rights.
- Newspapers and other information sources report frequently, accurately and positively about rights.
- Every young person and child should know who to go to if they feel their rights are not being met.
- There are lots of rights so people will need reminding about them, perhaps in the news or with adverts.
- Parents and carers should be helped to know about the rights their children have.
- People should be able to talk about respecting each others' rights.





## **Event Days and weeks in September:**

**International Day of Democracy -** Date: 15 Sen

What is it: The International Day of Democracy was established by the UN in 2007 as an opportunity to review the state of democracy in the world. In particular, the day celebrates the values of freedom, respect for human rights and the principle of holding genuine elections by universal suffrage.

Rights Link: Article 12: Respect for the views of the child

**World Peace Day -** Date: 21 Sep What is it: The International Day of Peace was established by the United Nations in 1981 as a day 'devoted to commemorating and strengthening the ideals of peace both within and among all nations and peoples'.

Rights Link: Article 38: War and armed conflicts

Bi Visibility Day - Date: 23 Sep

What is it: Marked each year since 1999 to highlight biphobia and to help people find the bisexual community.

Rights Link: Article 2: Non-discrimination, Article 13 – freedom of expression

## **International Right to Know Day -** Date: 28 Sep

What is it: The aim of Right to Know Day is to raise awareness of every individual's right of access to government-held information: the right to know how elected officials are exercising power and how tax-payers' money is being spent.

Rights Link: Article 17: Access to information from the Media



# School Routines, Attendance & Punctuality



It's lovely to see your children confidently arriving at school. After gates open at 8.45am, we encourage children from Year 5 to Year 8 to enter classes independently; when ready, please encourage your child to be dropped off at the KS2 or the KS3 side gate. From there, children can walk around the school to their classroom where teachers will be ready to greet them. My staff and myself are also on duty outside at the start and end of the day so that in this way, if you have any urgent messages, these can be shared. Alternatively, you can write a short message in your child's planner to share with their tutor.

# Safety in the morning and at the end of the day

As always, we ask everyone to continue to walk, cycle or scoot to school. When parking, please do also consider our local residents. Please do not block driveways or cause obstruction and do not park close to junctions. A reminder that people should adhere to the Highway Code. Please abide by the Highway Code: Rule 243 - DO NOT STOP OR PARK: • near a school entrance • anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services • in front of an entrance to a property. Everyone working together really can make a difference and is key to helping to make our school community safe.

## **Ensure that everything is named**

Thank you to everyone who has remembered to name items of clothing. If you haven't already done so, please name all items as soon as possible so that any mislaid items can be returned promptly to their owners.

## **Jewellery and nail varnish**

A reminder that children are not permitted to wear jewellery or earrings, other than studs, for those children with pierced ears. During PE, studs will need to be removed or covered with surgical tape. In general terms, you are advised not to allow your child to wear jewellery to school in case of loss, damage or injury. Make up, including nail varnish, is not appropriate in school and should also not be worn.
