Each week, we will now include a section in the newsletter on our 'Rights Respecting Schools Journey'. As we have previously shared, we were awarded Bronze: Rights Committed in July 2020, which is the first stage of the Rights Respecting Schools Award. It is primarily a planning stage for the second stage of the Rights Respecting Schools Award, Silver: Rights Committed, which we will be applying for in the new year. In order to continually embed the rights into our school, we have a weekly virtual assembly where we focus on an Article of the week. This week, we are looking at two articles, Articles 32 and 35 - Protection from Harmful Work & Prevention of Abduction, Sale and Trafficking. These mean that, 'Governments must protect children from economic exploitation and work that is dangerous or might harm their health, development or education. Governments must set a minimum age for children to work and ensure that work conditions are safe and appropriate' (Article 32) and that they must, 'Protect children from being abducted, sold or moved illegally to a different place in or outside their country for the purpose of exploitation' (Article 35). After the assembly, we then carry out activities in our tutor groups relating to the article of the week.

In Chameleon HQ this week, we have been learning about Pop Art. We researched Andy Warhol and had a go at creating some of our own Pop Art using a select range of colours.







Sleep is really critical to developing young brains. The NHS recommendations below, details the amount of sleep that children require:-

9 Years - 10 hours

10 Years - 9 hours 45 minutes

11 Years - 9 hours 30 minutes

12 Years – 9 hours 15 minutes



Screen Time before children's Bedtimes


The Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH) review of screen time harms found evidence of links between increased use and sleep disruption, obesity and mental health issues like anxiety and loneliness. In the first expert UK guidance aimed at helping parents prevent smartphones and console use becoming harmful, it has been advised that children should switch off screens an hour before bedtime.


