

#### **Rights Respecting School News**

#### **Exciting News**

We are so excited to announce that our Silver: Rights Aware virtual accreditation will be taking place in Summer Term 2, on the 15th of July. We cannot wait to share the progress that our school has made so far in embedding children's rights in to our school's ethos.

#### **Article of the Week**

This week, we are exploring Article 9 & Article 20, which are all about families. Article 9 says that no child or young person should be separated from their parents unless their parents are not acting in their best interests. If they have to be separated, they do have the right to stay in contact. Article 20 says that children, who can't live with their families are entitled to special protection and help. There are more than 65,000 children in the UK, who live in foster care and there are many thousands of children around the world, who are forced to be separated from their families due to war. May the 15th is the United Nations International Day for families. The 10th - 23rd of May is foster care fortnight. These events are a chance for us all to reflect on the importance of families and carers and how we can support those children who are forced to live apart from their parents and their family.







During our weekly assembly, we discussed the importance of families and carers, and we watched a video called 'What is family?' by Robot Songs. This really helped us to explore that families can come in all shapes and sizes and that respect, understanding and celebrating differences is key.

The Big Ask

The right to be heard is a key value within a Rights Respecting School (Article 12). Therefore, during ICT sessions, our children will be completing 'The Big Ask' survey. This is the largest survey of children and young people in England that there has ever been. The Children's Commissioner will use what the children tell them to show the government what they think, and what children need to live happier lives. 
#### **Fun At Forest School**
