# **Rights Respecting News**

<u>Article of the week</u> - In the last week of April, 'World Immunisation Week' is celebrated across the world. In school, we have been exploring, Article 6 and 24 of the UNCRC. World Immunisation Week is celebrated every year at the same time and during this week UNICEF share information to promote the use of vaccines to protect people against diseases. Vaccines are perhaps the most successful public health intervention in history, they save millions of lives every year. Thanks to a vaccine, we eradicated smallpox, which used to kill around 300 million people every year.

Thanks to vaccines, we've almost eradicated polio as well and it remains in just two countries. This year, during world immunisation week, the focus is looking at how vaccines bring us closer and how vital it is that the world works together to make sure that everyone has access to life saving immunisation. Sadly, 20 million children still go unvaccinated every year and therefore we've been learning about how this impacts their access to their rights and those of children all around the world because it's only when everyone is protected against a disease, that we are all truly safe from it.
