

#### Dear Parent/ Carer.

Your child has been selected to take part in a programme called 'Forest School'. Forest school is an opportunity for your child to experience nature and the outdoor environment in a safe, secure and hands on way.

Our 'forest' is a small area safely within the school grounds already has planted trees and wild flowers. Within the 'forest' school area we will create an area known as the fire circle where children can socialise, and where we may have campfires. We also use a range of tools in this area under 1:1 supervision.

A mixture of sycamore, oak, beech and silver birch trees can be found in the 'forest' school area, alongside bushes and many wild flowers. In addition to the trees and plants, there are old woodpiles to attract insects and small birds to our site. The children will be encouraged to investigate and explore nature, respecting all living things.

Research suggests that children learn best from first hand experiences. Exploring, playing and problem solving within the forest school area aims to encourage learning using a range of activities (both designed by the leader and instigated by the children themselves). Simultaneously, it supports children to develop a sense of independence, high self-esteem, teamwork and resilience where health and safety considerations are always of paramount importance.

The 'forest' school area we use is dry in the main but has a lot of sticks and plants underfoot. In order to ensure children are sufficiently protected from the weather and the forest school environment, and can participate fully and comfortably in each session, we advise the following clothing:

### Winter clothing

- Long sleeved top/jumper
- Long trousers
- Warm hat and gloves
- Wellies or trainers (no open toe shoes)
- Waterproof coat or other coat

\*We can provide waterproof coats and wellies if you do not have any for your child.

### Summer clothing

- Light long sleeved top
- Light long trousers
- Sun hat/cap
- Sun cream
- Wellies or trainers (no open toe shoes)

Children must wear long sleeves and long trousers in both winter and summer to protect them from insect bites, sunburn, stinging nettles and thorns. Furthermore, as this clothing may get muddy, old clothes are recommended.

Please can you complete the attached consent form and return to the school office by Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> April 2021. This is a wonderful opportunity for children to learn outdoors and apply their new learning within the classroom and if you have any queries, please do not hesitate to contact me.
