Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have enjoyed a lovely half term break and Jubilee Celebrations. We are looking forward to Summer 2 with lots of wonderful things planned for our school family.

Children at West Moors Middle School, across both our primary and secondary phases, take pride in their education and this begins each and every day by arriving to school in full uniform and prepared with all equipment.

## **School Uniform and Learning Equipment**

**Uniform** is a statement of pride in a school, a statement of belonging and a personal commitment by the individual to the school. We share the <u>school uniform expectations</u> with parents and carers at the start of each academic year, and our school uniform is smart, comfortable and practical, presenting a positive image of our school to both our local and wider community. It reflects the aspirations of our school and children are expected to wear it correctly at all times of the day. This in turn, helps to prepare your child for the phase in their education, as upper schools have similar high expectations with regard to school uniform and appearance, which will stand them in good stead in life. To prevent uniform getting lost, please make sure that each item is named using an iron-on, stick-on or sewn-in label, or by using a permanent naming pen.

All children are required to bring the **learning equipment** listed below every single day. Their tutor, to ensure that students are prepared and ready to learn, will check this daily. If a student does not have a piece of equipment, then they can purchase it from the school shop before school or in their break time. The following list of equipment is detailed in the children's planners:

- a pencil case with a ruler, rubber, pencils and a pencil sharpener
- a blue handwriting pen (not biro)
- 2 dry-wipe whiteboard pens
- a basic geometry set
- a calculator
- · a set of colouring pencils (including orange &
- purple)
- a calculator
- · a glue stick
- purple penyellow highlighter

(\*We will provide dry-wipe whiteboard pens for any child who does not have one this term).

We also have a small hardship fund to support any families who need help, and will provide children with learning equipment needed in a pencil case that they will keep in school. ### **Enrichment Clubs**

For the Summer term, if your child would like to attend any of the clubs appended, please can parents and carers <a href="CLICK HERE">CLICK HERE</a> to sign him/ her up and select scheduled sessions. This will only take a few minutes and it means that we can electronically collate whole school data to update the attendance registers. All enrichment clubs begin from week 2 of every half term (week commencing 13.06.2022), and all afterschool clubs will end between 16.30 and 16.35. These enrichment activities provide opportunities to encourage children to keep active, engage in competitive team sports and have fun with their friends- whilst simultaneously keeping them busy, and away from technology for a period of time. We would be grateful if you could encourage your children to take part in these enrichment opportunities, supporting mental health and well-being through exercise, teamwork and spending time with friends.

#### Homework

Homework is important because it enables students to:

- Continue learning outside of the classroom
- Consolidate newly-acquired knowledge, revise prior learning and practise skills
- Develop the self-discipline, perseverance and confidence to study independently
- Involve parents/carers in their learning.

Parents and carers should provide a well-lit desk in a quiet area for students to complete their homework. As we support our children's development of life long skills, to enable them to be the best that they can be, homework goes beyond just the task itself; it helps children take control of their workload and increase their time management skills. Homework is set with a deadline and taking ownership of this deadline helps them think independently and develop problem-solving skills, standing them in good stead for their futures at upper school, university and/ or college, and/ or the workplace.

It is therefore important that children complete their homework tasks set by the given date, maintaining our school's high standards. Please can we ask that parents and carers enquire to **see their child's homework before it is handed in**, as this will provide them with an opportunity to discuss the work with their child, ensure neat presentation and support the child in checking their work for spelling, punctuation and grammar.

#### **Summer Fair**

We are in the process of organising our summer fair and need to ask for help and support to ensure its success. Due to Covid-19, this will be the first Summer Fair possible in three years, and will take place on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July 2022 from 11.00-15.00. A flyer for this event has been appended to this letter, and a copy will be given to all children to take home tomorrow.

The school is currently raising funds to pay for an outdoor amphitheatre in the school field where the children will be able to perform in plays, poetry recitals and musical extravaganzas.
