

## **COVID SCENARIO FACTSHEET**

What to do if	Action Needed	Return to school when
my child has COVID-19 symptoms.	- Do not come to school	the test comes back negative or a period of 10 days has passed since the symptoms started, and the child feels well.
	- Contact school to inform us	
	- Self-isolate the whole household

	<ul> <li>Get a test for your child or anyone who is symptomatic in the household</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Inform the school immediately about the test result</li> </ul>	
my child tests positive for	- Do not come to school	10 days have passed since symptoms began, even if they still have a cough or loss of taste/smell. (these symptoms can last for several weeks.) AND the child feels well.
COVID-19	- Contact school to inform us	
	<ul> <li>Agree an earliest date for possible return (minimum of 10 days)</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Self-isolate the whole household (household members only need to get tested if they are symptomatic)</li> </ul>	
my child tests negative.	- Contact school to inform us	the test comes back negative
	<ul> <li>Discuss when your child can come back (same day/next day)</li> </ul>	
my child is ill with symptoms not linked to COVID-19	- Do not come to school	after 48 hours following the last bout of sickness or
	- Contact school to inform us	
	<ul> <li>Ring on each day of illness</li> </ul>	diarrhoea

What to do if	Action Needed	Return to school when
someone in my household has COVID-19 symptoms	<ul> <li>Do not come to school</li> <li>Contact school to inform us</li> <li>Self-isolate the whole household</li> <li>Household member to get a test</li> <li>Child does not need a test unless symptomatic</li> <li>Inform school immediately of test result</li> </ul>	the test comes back negative
someone in my household tests positive for COVID- 19 NHS test and trace has identified my child as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed COVID-19	<ul> <li>Do not come to school</li> <li>Contact school to inform us</li> <li>Agree an earliest date for possible return (minimum of 14 days)</li> <li>Self-isolate the whole household</li> <li>Do not come to school</li> <li>Contact school to inform us</li> <li>Agree an earliest date for possible return (minimum of 14 days)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>the child has completed 14 days of isolation.</li> <li>the child has completed 14 days of isolation.</li> </ul>
NHS test and trace has identified a household member (other than my child) as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed COVID-19	<ul> <li>The household member must self- isolate for 14 days.</li> <li>Child can continue to attend school.</li> </ul>	child can continue to attend school.

What to do if	Action Needed	Return to school when
a sibling attending another school has been sent home to self- isolate due to there being a positive case in their school.	<ul> <li>The sent home sibling must self-isolate for 14 days.</li> <li>Bournemouth School for Girls child can continue to attend school.</li> </ul>	child can continue to attend school.
my child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that is NOT on the exempt list of countries.	<ul> <li>Do not come to school</li> <li>If returning from a destination where quarantine is needed:</li> <li>Minimum of 14 days self-isolation for all those that travelled.</li> <li>Contact school to inform us you are back in the country and we will agree an earliest date for possible return to school.</li> <li>Self-isolate the whole household.</li> <li>Use <u>https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice</u> for up to date travel information</li> </ul>	the quarantine period of 14 days has been completed.
my child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that IS on the exempt list of countries.	<ul> <li>If returning form a destination where quarantine is NOT needed:</li> <li>Check the current exempt countries and territories list at_<a href="https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice">https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice</a> to confirm the country you have travelled from or through is on the exempt list.</li> <li>Ring school to inform us you have returned to the UK and agree a return date to school.</li> </ul>	you have informed the office of your return to the UK and you are exempt from self-isolation.

What to do if	Action Needed	Return to school when
I have travelled from a country that requires us to quarantine (but my child did not travel)	<ul> <li>As long as you do not have/have not had symptoms in the last 14 days, your child can continue to attend school.</li> <li>The person who has travelled MUST NOT leave the house, including to do pick-ups and drop offs.</li> </ul>	child can continue to attend school.
we have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding.	<ul> <li>Do not come to school.</li> <li>Contact school to inform us.</li> <li>Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>school inform you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to school again.</li> <li>you receive medical advice that your child may return to school.</li> </ul>
my child's bubble/ hub is closed due to a COVID-19 outbreak in school.	<ul> <li>Child must not come to school</li> <li>Support your child at home with remote education provided by your school.</li> <li>Your child will need to self-isolate for 14 days.</li> <li>Other siblings may continue to attend school</li> </ul>	school inform you that the bubble will be reopened.
I am unable to get a test for someone in the household.	<ul> <li>If you are unable to get a test in the first 5 days of having symptoms, your child and your household must self-isolate for 14 days.</li> </ul>	the child has completed 14 days of self-isolation.
