Did you know... just registering your child for Free School Meals means that the school gets extra money?

Register now to make sure we don't miss out!

The Government gives money to schools to help children from lower income families do their very best. This funding is called a 'Pupil Premium'. At West Moors Middle, we use this money to employ additional staff to target the learning needs of our students. We also use this money to supplement school trips and clubs or other enrichment opportunities for children who are eligible for free school meals.

If you think your child may be entitled to Free School Meals but they prefer to bring in a packed lunch from home, please still register to claim. Just registering means that the school can get this extra funding. Furthermore, if you are entitled, you could also get a clothing grant and help with the cost of residential trips.

Year 6 Numeracy Club

We have started an after school club every Wednesday for Year 6 students who are currently working at level 3 in maths and are working towards achieving level 4 (although all Year 6 students are welcome). These sessions are led by Mr Witton, Mrs Gould, Mrs Giller and Mrs Pritchard.

During these sessions we spend 45 minutes developing key numeracy skills before the students then take part in a 45 minute activity; playing football, cooking, or playing table tennis. We continue to develop their numeracy skills within the context of the activity they are doing, eg. measuring out ingredients or working out league tables and goal differences.



We have been really impressed with the enthusiasm and commitment shown by the pupils so far and we are excited about the progress they are making (we're even happier when they share their flapjacks with us!)

Holocaust Memorial Event

On Monday 20th January, twelve Year 8 pupils attended Bryanstone School with Mrs Pritchard and Mr Knight, one of our parent helpers, to remember the Holocaust.

We sat in the front seats of the theatre (which was huge), from where we had a great view of the stage. The first thing that happened was the lighting of the seven candles, which represented the Jewish people that had suffered and been discriminated against through the second world war.



Then we heard from a speaker called Harry Granville who had travelled on the Kindertransport to England. He was supposed to meet his family in America but he never saw them again. His mother was due to go to a concentration camp and his father and grandmother volunteered to go too so that she wouldn't be alone. It is incredibly sad that he lost his family but now he has a wife and children and grandchildren that all love him.

The other man that was supposed to speak (Ludwik Simonsohn) could not make it due to his wife being taken ill. It would have been inspirational to meet him because he was actually in a concentration camp and was identified as the boy in the photo on the right.

'It was really interesting.' *Mollie*




Thank you once again for giving us all really fun and interesting tours of Fawley Power Station these last few years!
