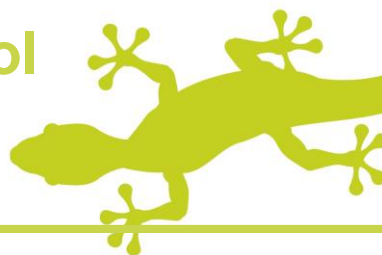

Message from the Head Teacher, Mr J Rielly

The whole school has much to live up to as the results from last year's SATs made West Moors the best performing Dorset middle school, according to the school league tables.

'Phil the Bag'

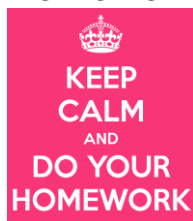
