Message from the Head, Mr J Rielly

The underlying theme of recent weeks has been **increased pupil involvement** in school life. I am pleased that tutor groups have elected members of the school council, who now meet every week. One of their first responsibilities was to lead the school assemblies during Anti-Bullying Week. Two members of the council also attended a Dorset Conference on this important issue. Indeed, this visit inspired the search for Peer Supporters (see below).

The school council were also instrumental in asking for a **revised rewards system**. As a result, we have launched pupil points to run alongside lizard points. Pupil points provide extra acknowledgement for those landmark moments in the progress made during a pupil's time with us. Lizard points reward the day-to-day achievements in all aspects of school life - well over 2500 lizard points have been acquired so far!

I am also delighted that, following a recommendation from the school council, we have introduced **Peer Supporters** to our school. Pupils from all year groups volunteered to do this very worthwhile role and were given training by a specialist teacher. Their main role is to be another point of contact for pupils, so that they can get support when they are experiencing friendship problems. They are a visible presence because of the bright yellow badges that they are wearing. It is only three weeks since their training and our Peer Supporters are already experiencing 'active service'.



Finally, I have been very proud that our pupils have been involved in events in the village of West Moors. As well as honouring Remembrance Day (more later), four pupils were chosen to read bible extracts during the 'Carols on the Petwyn' event. What a courageous thing to do in front of so many people – pupil point worthy indeed! Many year 5 and 6 pupils also made decorations to hang on our school's entry at the Christmas Tree Festival at the United Reformed Church. Each handmade decoration was labelled with one of our newly identified values. Fittingly, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a peaceful Christmas and a

prosperous New Year.

Remembrance Day


